My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there, and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

DAUGHTERS OF ISABELLA: The April meeting has been canceled and will not be rescheduled. At this time, it is uncertain if the regular May meeting will be held

ADDITIONAL DIRECTIVES FROM BISHOP JOHN BRUNGARDT: Due to information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the White House, and dioceses across the country, I am updating my pastoral directives for dealing with the coronavirus crisis. These are additional directives to be implemented in the Catholic Diocese of Dodge City no later than March 24, 2020. Let us trust in our Loving Lord to assist us in this time of need. **“Cast all our worries upon God because He cares for you.”** (1 Peter 5:7).

1. The maximum number of persons gathered in a diocesan function is now 10 persons. This includes funerals, weddings, baptisms, and the number of people in line for confessions. Please review with all present the need for six feet distance between people.
2. More clarity on confessions: The “box” confessionals or reconciliation rooms are not to be used. A screen is to be used in an open space, without kneelers, keeping six feet between the priest and penitent. Penitents are to confess standing, or using an armless chair to minimize hand contact with surfaces. “Background” music is suggested to reduce the chance of a confession being overheard.
3. Regularly sanitize door knobs, handles, etc.
4. Adoration chapels are to be closed at this time.
5. Those who are ill and vulnerable should stay at home.
6. The chancery and several parishes are livestreaming Masses: if you are, please email Eric Haselhorst so we can publish a list. I encourage the use of video or phone conferences for meetings, etc.
7. Keep in mind the elderly, the ill, those unable to leave their homes, those without Internet, and the poor. As St. Paul teaches: **“we were to be mindful of the poor”** (Galatians 2:10). How do we reach out in this crisis? Some parishes have staff and council members call each family; others use the “phone tree” method.

Trust in Jesus, He is with us always. Ask the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary. Thank you for your faithfulness. Be assured of my prayers for each of you.

FROM FR. JOHN: Due to the new directives a screen will be put on the sanctuary of the church (behind the altar) without a kneeler. An armless chair will be put there for the penitent but the Penitent can also confess standing. Background music will be played. Please if you come to church and someone is with the priest wait at the back pew for your turn.
