MASS IS BACK: We will resume public Holy Masses on Wednesday, June 17, 2020, at church at 8:30 a.m. The number of new coronavirus cases per day has decreased dramatically in Ford County in the last three weeks. After much consulting, pondering, and praying, the bishop believes we can safely resume our liturgical life in the entire diocese now, within the guidelines published on May 20, 2020. There will be morning Masses from Tuesday through Friday. Time for weekday Masses:.....8:30 a.m. Venue: At Church Weekend Masses: Saturday 4:00 p.m. Sunday8:00 a.m. Please note the following:

- All the faithful continue to be dispensed from the obligation to participate in Holy Mass, until further notice.
- Each family is strongly urged to bring hand sanitizer and use it before entering the church. Doors will be opened so you will not be touching this area. Sanitizers will be available at the doors in case you forget to bring your own.
- Ushers will be available to direct you to a pew.
- Members of a household may sit together. A six-foot distance will be maintained in all directions between others.
- Each person is strongly urged to bring and humbly wear a face mask (or other facial covering like a bandana or scarf) during Holy Mass, except for the moment of receiving Holy Communion.
- Priests and Eucharistic Ministers are required to wear a mask during the distribution of Holy Communion.
- Collection baskets will be provided at the entrance.
- There will be no offertory procession.
- The Sign of Peace continues to be suspended.
- Holy Communion to the faithful via the Precious Blood continues to be suspended.
- If you feel your health would be compromised by gathering with others, you are not obligated to attend Mass at this time.
- You will be receiving mails detailing all the protocols we need to observe in attending Mass.

Liturgy Commission:
Liturgy is at the heart of our all parish life. The revised General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that Liturgy is the primary and indispensable source from which we; the faithful derive our true Christian Spirit. The entire celebration is planned in such a way that it leads to a conscious, active and full participation of all of us both in body and mind. Saints Peter and John prepared the Passover meal for Jesus and his disciples. Where and whenever the early church gathered each Sunday to celebrate, someone made sure the people were welcomed, the place well arranged, prayers and scriptures made available. Liturgy committees exist principally to prepare people’s hearts and minds, the church, and make ready the materials and all the things needed for the celebration of the sacraments. What we do regularly as Liturgy Commission members in our parish include:

- o Promotion of liturgical development,
- o Participation and planning for Sunday Mass, seasonal celebrations,
- o Celebration of the sacraments, etc.
- o Overseeing the training of liturgical ministers
- o Providing for the care of the church, the sanctuary and all liturgical supplies, (candles, candle holders, altar servers cassocks and
- o Preparation and submission of annual budget to the Finance Commission

Church and Community Affairs:

- o Promote activities of community life within our parish
- o Facilitates Church & Community activities: pancake breakfast, soup supper, funeral dinners, etc.
- o Keep up to date the Parish Directory and Parish census
- o Prepare and submit an annual budget to the Finance Commission

Finance:

- o Oversees financial bookkeeping and secretarial work
- o Counts the Sunday Collection
- o Provide funds necessary for the operation and maintenance of the parish
- o Evaluates and approves the commission budgets and submits them to the Parish Council for approval.
- o Makes recommendations and oversees all fund raising projects and investments
- o Evaluate insurance policies
- o Responsible for periodic financial report and an annual statement
- o Sign the annual financial statement and forward it to the church offices of the Dodge City Diocese

Liturgy:

- o Works together with the priest and Coordinator of Ministries to foster the spiritual growth of the parish community through liturgy
- o Promote liturgical development, participation and planning for Sunday Mass, seasonal celebrations, celebration of the sacraments, etc.
- o Oversee the training of liturgical ministers
- o Assist the liturgy coordinator
- o Provide for the care of the church, the sanctuary and all liturgical supplies, (candles, candle holders, altar servers cassocks

- o Prepare and submit an annual budget to the Finance Commission

Property:

- o Provide an on-going inspection of all parish property (church, rectory, center/hall, grounds, cemetery) for necessary repairs, improvements and maintenance
- o Provide for the purchase of equipment and supplies for the above
- o Provide for the sale of church property
- o Make an inventory of all parish equipment
- o Prepare and submit an annual budget to the Finance Commission

Youth:

- o Provide a program of education for the K-12 youth of the parish
- o Encourage and promote youth activities
- o Keep parish and community volunteer programs
- o Determine and policies that guide the PSR (Parish School of Religion)
- o Assist the DRE in recruiting teachers and personnel and provide training
- o Publicize and encourage attendance at Diocesan workshops and programs
- o Prepare and submit an annual budget to the Finance Commission

Faith Formation:

- o Help foster adult formation in the parish
- o Maintain a parish library (CD’s, books, pamphlets, family and/or adult conferences, etc.
- o Publicize and encourage attendance at Diocesan workshops and programs
- o Prepare and submit an annual budget to the Finance Commission
